## Storm Water and What can I do?

- NEVER Dump ANY waste into the storm drains—**IT IS ILLEGAL**
- Pick Up pet waste and discard it properly
- Wash your vehicle(s) at a commercial car wash, or on a UNPAVED surface such as your lawn
- DO NOT Drain your swimming pool into the street or a storm drain
- Keep grass clippings in your yard not in the street or sidewalks
- Use less fertilizer on your lawn and gardens. Keep fertilizer off sidewalks and streets
- Recycle used oil—Take to an approved recycling station
- Remove debris and trash clogging your storm drain

Old Lycoming Township Police Department will again coordinate Penn Dot’s Police Traffic Services Grant for Lycoming County. The PTS grant includes local police department participation in impaired driving, occupant protection, and aggressive driving enforcement activities. Our goal is not to write more tickets but use high visibility, enforcement and education to get people to buckle up, drive safely and avoid operating vehicles on our roadways while under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Permanent AND temporary swimming pools, decks, driveways, fences, prior to the placement, erection, construction, demolition, addition or alteration of any building, structure or land and prior to use change of a building or parcel as well as prior to any development in a floodplain
